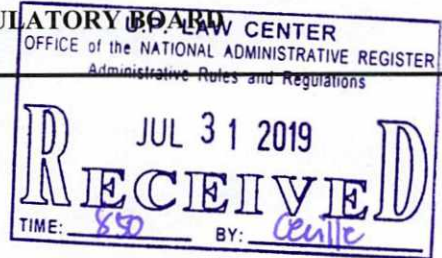

MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR
NUMBER 2019- 034

SUBJECT: POLICY ON APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF VALIDITY OF EXPIRED CPC OF TNVS

In order to have a standing policy regarding application for extension of validity of expired Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC) of Transportation Network Vehicle Services (TNVS), and due to the clamor from TNVS operators during consultative meetings, the Board, in the exercise of its authority to promulgate rules and regulations in the operations of land based public utility vehicles hereby adopts the following terms and conditions in the filing of application for extension of validity of expired CPCs.

1. Applications for Extension of Validity may be filed six (6) months prior to the date of expiration of the CPC.
2. Only CPCs that expired within six (6) months shall be accepted for filing without need to file Motion to Accept Late Filing, but subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - 2.1. Applications shall cover TNVS only;
 - 2.2. Regular penalty of FIVE THOUSAND PESOS (Php 5, 000.00) per unit;
 - 2.3. In addition to the regular penalty, a penalty for late filing in the amount of FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (Php 500.00) per unit and per month shall be imposed.
3. Those with pending Motions to Accept Late Filing of Application for Extension of Validity filed within six (6) months from the expiration of CPC shall be accepted and processed without need of issuance of corresponding Order, but subject to same penalties as mentioned above.

For the purpose of this Memorandum Circular, the date of filing of application shall be on the date when the applicant has fully paid the fees assessed by the Board and the receipt of this Board of the application filed.

This Memorandum Circular supersedes any and all Issuances inconsistent herewith and takes effect immediately following its publication in a newspaper of general circulation and filing of three (3) copies hereof with the UP Law Center pursuant to Presidential Memorandum Circular No. 11 dated 9 October 1992.
