RESOLUTION NO. 259 Series of 2019

(Re: RE-OPENING OF PUBLIC UTILITY VEHICLE ROUTES for the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX) and augmentation of existing PUVs serving the terminal – applications on the route: PITX - BAYAN LUMA, IMUS)

WHEREAS, before this Committee are the applications of the following, to wit:

1. ECO DYIP, INC.;
2. GREEN EARTH TRANSPORT SERVICES COOPERATIVE;
3. ANABU TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVE;

for PITX - BAYAN LUMA, IMUS route with the use of fifty (50) authorized Class 2 PUJ units, under the selection/qualification process on 11 September 2019 pursuant to Resolution No. 218 series of 2019;

WHEREAS, the Committee found that ECO DYIP, INC. submitted the sales invoice (Vehicle Sales Invoice Nos.: VSI-00008416, VSI-00008417 and VSI-00008418 from Columbian Autocar Corporation) of its fifteen (15) units to be used for the interim operation. No undertaking was submitted as to the delivery of the 25%, 50% and 100% required compliant units within three (3), six (6) and nine (9) months respectively;

WHEREAS, the Committee found that ECO DYIP, INC. failed to submit/provide the following documentary requirements set forth under the Technical Qualification of Memorandum Circular No. 2019-013, to wit:

1. Undertaking that the units shall be compliant with the specifications and standards under OFG and DTI-PNS;
2. Undertaking that Eco Dyip, Inc. will immediately comply with the approved LPTRP/DOTr rationalization study;
3. Fleet Management System with organized vehicle dispatch procedures;

WHEREAS, the Committee found that ECO DYIP, INC. failed to submit/provide all documentary requirements set forth under the Financial Capability of Memorandum Circular No. 2019-013;

WHEREAS, GREEN EARTH TRANSPORT SERVICES COOPERATIVE were given a rating of "PASSED/QUALIFIED" as it fully complied with the Qualification Requirements - Legal, Technical and Financial Capability Qualifications provided under Memorandum Circular No. 2019-013;

WHEREAS, the Committee found that ANABU TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVE failed to submit/provide the following documentary requirements set forth under Memorandum Circular No. 2019-013, to wit:

1. Letter of Intent;
2. Original or certified true copy of its Certificate of Registration, Articles and By-Laws, latest Cooperative Annual Performance Report duly issued by the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) and Certificate of Accreditation issued by the Office of Transportation Cooperative;
3. Undertaking that Anabu Transport Service Cooperative will immediately comply with the approved LPTRP/DOTr rationalization study;

4. Copies of Letter of Support from property owners/managers regarding access to, or use of, each off-street loading and unloading area in both endpoints;
5. Proof of financial capability of at least equal to the set-aside bank deposit, duly certified by the depository bank, which is equivalent to fifty thousand pesos (Php 50,000.00) for PUJ services per unit, multiplied by the total number of vehicles for the route;

WHEREAS, ANABU TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVE submitted an undertaking to provide evidence of formal arrangement with AFC service provider, hence, no submission of appropriate evidence of said formal arrangement;

WHEREAS, ANABU TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVE submitted an Independent Auditor's Report and is not signed by a Certified Public Accountant with no financial statement attached;






WHEREAS, no number of compliant PUV units is indicated in its submission of undertaking for the delivery of the required number of units and its submission of undertaking for the manner of acquisition, hence, due to no proper basis or relation to the PUV units, the submissions made by ANABU TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVE are considered a failure;

NOW THEREFORE, premises considered, this Committee resolves to recommend to the Board to:

1. **DENY** the applications of ECO DYIP, INC. and ANABU TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVE for failing to comply with the documentary requirements set forth under Memorandum Circular No. 2019-013;
2. **AWARD** the PITX - BAYAN LUMA, IMUS route in favor of **GREEN EARTH TRANSPORT SERVICES COOPERATIVE**.
