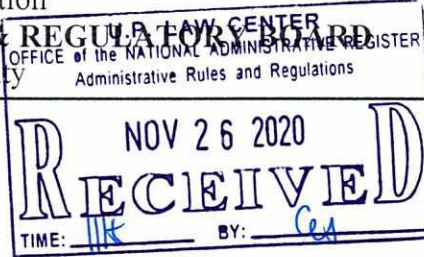

MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR
NUMBER 2020- 078

SUBJECT : Amendment to Memorandum Circular No. 2015-013 (re: Guidelines to Govern the Accreditation of GPS Device Provider)

WHEREAS, the Board issued Memorandum Circular No. 2015-013, prescribing the guidelines to govern the accreditation of GPS Device Provider, which was later on amended by Memorandum Circular No. 2015-024, and further amended by Memorandum Circular No. 2016-016;

WHEREAS, after constant monitoring, it has been observed that existing GPS Device Providers failed to religiously comply with their mandatory reporting system, which hinders the development of the Board's new Central Public Utility Vehicle Monitoring System (CPUVMS);

WHEREAS, the Development Team (CPUVMS Proponents) and DOST-ASTI together with the LTFRB Technical Team conducted testing of data submitted by the device providers where most of them failed to comply with the data format and some are unresponsive;

WHEREAS, the purpose of having the Central Public Utility Vehicle Monitoring System (CPUVMS) is for the live monitoring of Public Utility Vehicles, and this cannot be done without real-time data transmitted by the GPS Devices to the central monitoring system;

WHEREAS, the target date for the launching of the Central Public Utility Vehicle Monitoring System (CPUVMS) is set on the last month of year 2020;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing, and by virtue of Section 5(k) of Executive Order No. 202 which empowers the Board to formulate, promulgate, administer, implement and enforce rules and regulations on land transportation public utilities, the Board hereby **AMENDS** I. item no. 3 of Memorandum Circular No. 2015-013, which now prescribes that all GPS Devices must be able to send data to the server at least every ten (10) seconds. Further, all existing accredited GPS Device Providers are required to submit their GPS Devices for RE-INSPECTION to ensure compatibility with the Board's new system.

Failure to meet the above-mentioned requirements, including any unsuccessful or failed data transmission of GPS device to CPUVMS shall be a ground for the cancellation of the Certificate of Accreditation, without prejudice on the part of the GPS Device Provider to comply and submit his device for re-inspection within five (5) calendar days from the date of last inspection.

This Memorandum Circular shall take effect immediately following its publication in at least one (1) newspaper of general circulation. Let three (3) copies hereof be filed with the UP Law Center- Office of National Administrative Registrar (ONAR).

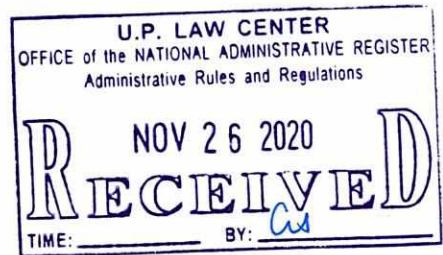
